## About

Roswell High School is located 18 miles north of Atlanta. Our School is proud of its rigorous academics, competitive athletics, extensive fine arts, innovative STEM offerings and a robust career and technical education department. Roswell's student organizations are a vast melting pot of ideas and voices. Our greatest assets are our diverse student body, dedicated administration, teachers and staff, caring counselors, engaged families and our historic relationship with the city of Roswell, Georgia.

## Mission

Roswell High School's mission is to create a positive and safe learning environment, to foster the development of each student's potential and to provide pathways to success after graduation.

## Student Body

Our 2021-2022 enrollment of 2,274 produced 501 graduates. Roswell's graduation rate was 89.4%, exceeding the state of Georgia. 74% of the seniors attended 4yr colleges, 8% attended 2yr colleges and our strong CTAE programs developed technical skills of additional graduates for trade professions. 54% of the student body participated in 17 different sports and 23% were active in performing arts. ## Graduation Requirements

**Each school year** is divided into two, 18-week semesters. The fall semester ends in December and the spring semester concludes in May.

**Each semester** students take 6 courses to fulfill credits.

**Each course** is ½ credit except for Dual Enrollment courses which are awarded 1 credit per semester.

**Roswell does not use class rank except for the Valedictorian and Salutatorian.**

Weighted grades are used to calculate numeric average. 7 points are added to the final passing grade of all AP, Honors, Dual Enrollment and Accelerated courses.

**CCRPI** Content Mastery for Fulton County High Schools exceeded Georgia scores by 8.6 points and graduation rates surpassed the state by 4.7 points.

## AP Courses

AP coursework is available for students in grades 9-12 with limited availability to grades 9 and 10. In 2022, 688 students took 1440 exams and 79.4% of students scored a 3 or higher on a 1-5 scale.
